

MICKEY'S VERY MERRY CHRISTMAS PARTY



Ho, ho, ho! Our *Mickey's Very Merry Christmas Party* Park Plan will help you hit the highlights with the lowest wait times. And we have two different versions, specifically for **families and adults.**

ARRIVAL (4 P.M.)

Arrive early.

With a party ticket, guests can enter *Magic Kingdom*® Park as early as 4 p.m. Allow extra time for transportation, parking and going through security and the entrance touchpoints.

Grab your wristband.

If you're already in the park before 4 p.m. as a daytime guest, go to a wristband distribution location between 4-7 p.m. so you can stay inside the park. If you arrive after 4 p.m., you'll get your wristband upon arrival through the designated touchpoints.



PRE-PARTY TIME (4 P.M. TO 7 P.M.)

Identify your priorities.

With so many special entertainment and activities to do in a limited time, it's important to identify your group's top priorities before the party starts, whether it's your tadpoles wanting to meet Santa Claus or your adult frog squad *hopping* on as many rides as you can.

Grab dinner and watch the “Frozen Holiday Surprise” show (6:15 p.m.).

Take the extra time now to fuel up before the party starts. We recommend grabbing a quick-service meal from Casey's Corner, and sitting in front of Cinderella Castle to watch the “Frozen Holiday Surprise” show, featuring “Frozen” characters.

Hit the rides.

Are you focusing on special entertainment, holiday treats and characters? Go on rides now. Not all rides and shows are open during the party, so make sure to prioritize any must-dos. Save any rides with special overlays for the party.

Visit standard characters.

During this time, meet characters who wear the same outfit during the day and the party, or characters who don't attend the party. Save characters dressed in their holiday best for the party.



PARTY TIME (7 P.M. TO 12 A.M.)

Prioritize characters.

If you must visit a certain character, such as Santa Claus in Storybook Circus, be sure to do so earlier in the night, as some may leave their location to be in the parade or their line may close 30 minutes before the party ends. Double check with a cast member to find out how long a line is. For a full list of character locations, *hop* over to our blog!

Watch the first parade in Town Square or Frontierland® (8:30 p.m.).

For a view in *Main Street, U.S.A.*® with shorter notice, grab a spot in front of the *Walt Disney World*® Railroad station in Town Square. Stick around to see snowfall on *Main Street, U.S.A.*®. For the best last-minute availability, you can find a spot in *Frontierland*®.

Find a spot for the second stage show (9:25 p.m.) and fireworks (10 p.m.).

Once the parade is over, move as close as you can toward Cinderella Castle for Mickey's Most Merriest Celebration and Minnie's Wonderful Christmastime Fireworks.



PARTY TIME (7 P.M. TO 12 A.M.)

FAMILIES

Get your wiggles out.

Dance the night away at Club Tinsel in *Tomorrowland*[®] or with Disney Junior Pals at the Disney Junior Jingle Jam at Cosmic Ray's Starlight Cafe.

Go hunting for holiday treats and merch.

Collect your complimentary cookies and holiday beverages at the holiday treat stations. Be sure to snag any party-exclusive specialty treats, as well! Opt to shop later in the night, so you're not carrying items around or waiting in long lines.

Circle back to characters and sprinkle in your favorite rides for the rest of the party.

With the remaining time left, catch any characters you may have missed or go on your favorite rides — both of which have lower wait times as the night goes on. Don't *froget* about the rides with special holiday overlays:

- *Tomorrowland*[®] Speedway Race Through the Holidays
- *Monsters, Inc. Laugh Floor*[®] Holiday Show
- *Space Mountain*[®] - Holiday Run
- Mad Tea Party
- Jingle Cruise*

PARTY TIME (7 P.M. TO 12 A.M.)

ADULTS

Prioritize characters.

If you must visit a certain character, be sure to do so earlier in the night, as some may leave their location to be in the parade or their line may close 30 minutes before the party ends. Double check with a cast member to find out how long a line is. For a full list of character locations, *hop* over to our blog!

Hit the rides during the first parade.

Wait times for rides are low during the first parade, so take advantage of these short times for rides such as TRON Lightcycle / Run. Don't *froget* about the rides with special holiday overlays:

- *Monsters, Inc. Laugh Floor*® Holiday Show
- *Space Mountain*® - Holiday Run
- Mad Tea Party
- Jingle Cruise*

Find a spot for fireworks (10 p.m.).

Head to the hub by 9:45 p.m. to get in place for Minnie's Wonderful Christmastime Fireworks. Some people will be sticking around after the stage show, while others may be leaving.
